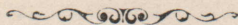

Ltd. and which claim you subsequently returned with a request that we should obtain the Insurance Policies, we now enclose the claim (in duplicate) and we also enclose original Fire Policy No. 8721837 effected by the Company with The London & Lancashire Fire Insurance Company in the sum of £6783. 6. 8. with receipt (No. 1441) for the premium to Ladyday 1917 attached, also original Policy No. 1234929 effected by the Company with The Yorkshire Insurance Co. Ltd. in the sum of £13,566. 13. 4. with receipt (No. 1510) for the premium to Lady Day 1917 annexed. It appeared to our Clients that these Policies did not bear on the claim, as the claim is made in respect of property destroyed or looted and not property burned.

In answer to your enquiry, the claim does not include a claim for property consigned to other persons, but solely for goods the property of the British & Irish Company.

at 12 Hollybrook Road, Clontarf in the City of Dublin General Manager of the British & Irish Steam Packet Company Limited, whose registered office is at 29 Sir John Rogerson's Quay, Dublin do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the 28<sup>th</sup> day of April

1916, damage was done to the undermentioned Property, namely:—  
*\*to certain particulars of the premises of the company at Sir John Rogerson's Quay and certain property in said premises so detailed in list "A" hereto annexed and signed with my name. certain property of the company in said premises was also removed by riotous persons unlawfully assembled, the particulars being detailed in list "B" hereto annexed and signed with my name and certain goods and stores of the company were destroyed by said riotous and tumultuous persons the details of these goods and stores being set out in list "C" hereto annexed and signed with my name*  
and such damage was occasioned to the best of my belief by\*\*  
*said persons riotously and unlawfully assembled who wantonly destroyed the articles and property as specified in lists "A" and "C" and who removed the property specified in list "B"*
