## NOTICE.

The attention of Consumers of Gas is directed to the following Sections taken from the Acts of Parliament governing the Company's **Gas Works Clauses Act, 1871.**

Meters not to be connected or disconnected without notice

15. "No Consumer shall connect any meter, with any pipe through which gas is supplied by the Undertakers to such meter, or disconnect any meter from any such pipe unless he shall have given to the Undertakers not less than twenty-four hours' notice in writing of his intention so to do, and if any person acts in contravention of this Section, he shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings."

Power to enter buildings for ascertaining quantity of gas consumed.

21. "Any officer appointed by the Undertakers, may at all reasonable times enter any building or land lighted with gas supplied by the Undertakers, in order to inspect the meters, fittings, and works for the supply of gas, and for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of gas consumed or supplied; and if any person hinder such officer as aforesaid from entering and making such inspection as aforesaid at any reasonable time, he shall for every such offence forfeit to the Undertakers a sum not exceeding five pounds."

### ALLIANCE AND DUBLIN GAS ACT, 1909.

Gas consumers to give notice to Company before removing.

33. "Twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall be given to the Company by every consumer of gas supplied by the Company before he shall quit any premises supplied with gas, by meter, by the Company, and in default of such notice the consumer so quitting shall be liable to pay to the Company the money accruing due in respect of such supply up to the next usual period for ascertaining the register of the meter on such premises, or the date from which any subsequent occupier of such premises shall require the Company to supply gas to such premises whichever shall first occur. Notice of the effect of this enactment shall be stated in every demand note for gas rent payable to the Company."

Notice of discontinuance

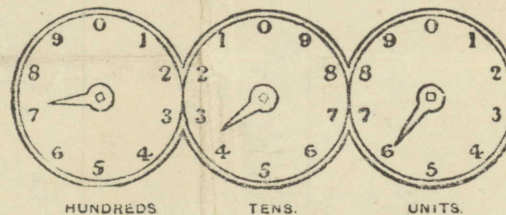
34. "A notice to the Company from a consumer for the discontinuance of a supply of gas shall not be of any effect, unless it be in writing, signed by or on behalf of the consumer, and be left at, or sent by post to the office of the Company."

**GAS METERS**—If an escape of Gas is perceived, which cannot immediately be stopped, the Gas should be turned off at the Main Cock until a Gasfitter be procured, and notice given to the Company. It is particularly requested that in all cases where a Meter becomes defective, from accident or otherwise, immediate notice be given at the Company's Office.

### CHEAP FUEL—COKE.

Coke is a most superior and economical fuel for all purposes requiring a clean, clear and strong heat; for malting, drying corn, raising steam, but more especially for household and culinary purposes, it is admirably adapted. As Kitchen fuel, Coke has long been in use in the principal Hotels and Club Houses in the City, and if more known, would soon be brought into general consumption—one chaldron and a-half being equivalent in point of heat, to two tons of the best Newcastle Coal.

#### INDEX OF METER IN HUNDREDS OF CUBIC FEET.



The Gas Company recommends every Consumer to keep his own register of the quantity of Gas consumed. If this be done frequently, any waste caused by escapes, or the extravagant use of Gas, will be detected.

If the state of the index is written down, and two cyphers are added to this number, the quantity consumed will be indicated. Thus, in the above diagram, the index stands at 736, add to this two cyphers and it will become 73,600, or seventy-three thousand six hundred.

If at the next examination, the index stands at	...	752
Deduct the previous registration	...	736
And the difference	...	16

Will represent 1,600 cubic feet.

Notice that the order of the figures in the middle dial is reversed.
