
RE REBELLION CLAIMS

Interests in the buildings Having satisfied myself that the articles were abstracted from claimant's Motor Car, whilst held in trust on her behalf by Messrs Taggart & Company of South King St, I proceeded to enquire from them what, in their opinion, they considered fair compensation for the loss, and they informed me confidentially

Award of Committee: Contents that a nominal 30/-, or at most £2, per Bag say, £4 for the two Bags, would be ample compensation. They were very emphatic on my insistence in procuring from the claimant

she was unable to produce at my subsequent interview. She merely stated that they were purchased in London, and were given to her by a gentleman as presents.

With regard to the last item in the

Claim, i.e. "Waterproof Coat £3.10/-" it is questionable if claimant is in order in

seeking Compensation, as the Coat belonged to a gentleman, whom she alleged is serving as a private in the Army, in France. She further stated that she has already made a cash payment, varying from £3.10/- down to the actual amount, £2, claimed,

to him under this item. This procedure on claimant's part may be quite within the bounds of possibility, but ^{it} seems somewhat strange to me that a gentleman should readily accept a cash payment from a Lady in such peculiar circumstances.

However, in view of all the facts, I consider that £5 would be reasonable Compensation.
