Dear Sir,

With reference to two claims lodged by me, one on behalf of Messrs Marconi's Wireless Telegraph Company for £642.13. 0., and the other for Mr Philip Keston Turner for £232.18. 6.

Both of these claims have been lodged by me on behalf of the Marconi's Wireless Telegraph Company. The circumstances under which this was done were as follows:

At the time of the destruction of the property Mr Turner held a Commission in the Royal Flying Corps. He was, therefore, not in a position to file the claim himself,

and on the 17th June last he wrote a letter to Messrs Marconi authorising them to take all the necessary steps to file a claim on his behalf, they to deduct out of any


compensation that might be awarded a sufficient sum to pay them for the goods they lost, and also a reasonable

sum to cover their expenses in making the claim. Under these circumstances I would be glad if you would make the cheques for the sum awarded in both claims payable

to Messrs Marconi, and forward same to me on their behalf.

I herewith enclose you copies of Mr Turner's two letters to the Marconi Company, dated respectively the 11th June and 17th June 1916. I have shown the originals of these letters to your Assessors, and, if you wish it, I can also produce them for your inspection.

Gentlemen,

I have just received your letter of the 1st inst. re my Dublin School.

The destruction of this has placed me in an extremely difficult position. As you will see from the heading of this letter, I am not myself in Dublin, having joined the R.F.C. in October last. The school has been in charge of my Secretary, Miss Kiernan.

Now the school has been utterly destroyed and my secretary is prostrate with shock, and, furthermore, I am absolutely unable to do anything in the matter myself as I am ordered overseas by the 20th inst.

Incidentally, with the school has gone every asset in my possession, leaving me entirely dependent on army pay.

Under these circumstances I am wondering whether yourselves will care to undertake the compensation claim, charging me out of the proceeds with a fair price for your trouble. If you will agree to this I will send you the address of my Dublin accountant, who will give you full particulars of amount to claim.

I could come down and discuss the matter with you, but not untill about the 20th of the month, on my way overseas.
