Reference attached correspondence, which is presumably intended for me, I would point out that my name is spelled McCammon. I am not now serving with the 5th Battalion Royal Irish Rifles but with the 20th Battalion Royal Irish Rifles. Whilst in Dublin I was in Command of the Ulster Composite Battalion formed as under -

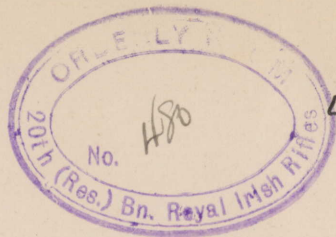
