Interests in the buildings

Claimant comes of a highly respected family and was left the property a few years ago. He resides in Dublin but at intervals goes to Solsborough. He was there at the time of the Rebellion. The rebels entered the premises and seized the double barrel gun and the rifle. The former by Newman of Portsmouth was purchased in 1890 for £31. 10. 0. by Mr. G. H. Jones of the United Services Club. I have interviewed Mr. W. J. Shannon, Solicitor, who was with Claimant and was using the gun for sporting purposes prior to its being seized, for an independent opinion, and he corroborates Claimant's statement. The Rock Rifle was purchased some years ago.
