I Kate Coyle, formerly residing at 7 Moore Street, but now residing We at 85 North Strand Road, in the City of Dublin, County of Dublin, Wife of John Coyle do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the 29th day of April

1916, damage was done to the undermentioned Property, namely: \* a number of articles of clothing which belonged to me & which were completely destroyed by fire in above premises No. 7, Moore Street

Street, resulting in my receiving several bullet wounds. I was confined in the Rotunda Hospital for 8 weeks & had to pay 10/- per week for my treatment. I am aged 75 years, and had nothing whatsoever, directly or indirectly, to do with the Insurrection when occurring on the 24th April 1916 nor had anyone belonging to me.



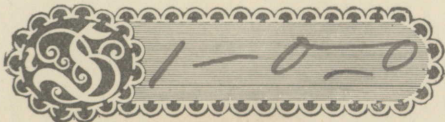
