SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT.

Claim 4768 McNulty.

I had an interview with the Claimant with reference to this case. He states the Urn in question had been in his family for one hundred years. He left it at Rooney's of College Street, to have the cock removed as he intended converting it into a Flower Pot. He mentioned that Rooney said it was worth £10, but Rooney denies that he ever made any statement as to the value of the article, as he is a worker in Brass, and was not competent to say what the value was. He however, mentioned to me that in his own private opinion he thought it might fetch £6. When he received it he described it as being like black-lead and portion was oxidized. He removed the tap and filled in the hole with copper and sent it to Kane to silver over the part where the copper had been inserted and to clean it up. I had a further interview with Kane who is still of the opinion that £3, 10. 0. was the value of the Urn. If the article in question was put up for auction in a good-glass auction mart, I very much doubt if it would fetch more than £3. 10. 0.. I accordingly recommend payment of this amount,
