

Re/ MESSRS. NOBLETT'S CLAIM

Special Considerations why claim for Cash lost should be allowed.

1. It was impossible to bank the money lost. Messrs. Noblett's Dublin branches bank (on account) on Thursday morning in each week all money received up to closing time of the previous Wednesday, keeping a balance on hands for expenses, and close the banking lodgments for the week on Monday mornings. As Friday the 21st, Saturday 22nd and Monday 24th April were all Bank Holidays there was no opportunity after banking on Thursday morning for further banking until after the Rebellion had broken out. The amount received on Thursday morning before Bank closing hour was only about £2 or £3. This is the average sum on a normal day during the morning hours. It follows that even if it had been the custom to make daily lodgments, it would not have been possible to have saved the money claimed.
2. The Safe in which the money was deposited was carried away bodily by the looters.
3. The following are the particulars of the lost takings at Nos. 34 & 67, Lower Sackville Street respectively. The takings at the Grafton Street house were saved.

As a test of the accuracy of these figures the Committee might kindly consider the following evidence.

Holy Week is one of the best weeks in the year.

4. The takings for Holy Week 1916 including the few pounds taken on the morning of Easter Monday was £501 and is accounted for above. The corresponding figure for Holy Week 1915 was £532 and for Holy Week 1914 was £446.

5. Of the £501 plus about £5, the takings during the morning of Easter Monday, total almost £506, the sum of £185 was banked or expended on the company's behalf and £321 was stolen with the Safe.

6. According to Messrs. Noblett's rules the Dublin Manageress sends daily advices to the Head Office in Liverpool of the amount of the takings. She did so on Thursday the 20th April and Friday 21st April and both these advices are attached hereto. The advices for Saturday 22nd April and Sunday 23rd April were posted by her on Monday morning before the outbreak but they never reached Liverpool and were probably lost in the G. P. O. Dublin. The Manageress is prepared to swear that she sent these advices, and also as to amounts included in each.




