re SAMUEL HALE'S CLAIMS

I am well acquainted with Samuel Hale who has made 2 claims in connection with the damage done to property belonging to him at 3 & 4 Waterford Street respectively immediately after the Rebellion. I have an intimate knowledge of the class of business carried on by Mr Hale and have assisted him in business on numerous occasions. I was often in the above premises and shortly before the Rebellion I was through the premises 3 & 4 Waterford street and had an opportunity on this and on the previous occasions of seeing the amount and class of stock belonging to Mr Hale on these premises. I have read to me the full details from the two claims lodged by Mr Hale, upon a copy of which claim I have now signed my name and I say that to the best of my knowledge and memory the items of stock mentioned in said two claims were on Mr Hale's premises as aforesaid shortly before the Rebellion and during the Rebellion. I was on the premises a few days previous to the damage being done and also immediately after the property on the premises had been destroyed and I honestly think that all the items mentioned in the two claims as being stored on the premises were destroyed on or about the 7th day of May 1916 by being burnt and broken by some persons or person unknown. It is very hard of course to remember every ~~item~~ article stored on the premises, but so far as I remember the property and articles mentioned in the Claims are substantially correct.
