I have gone through each item of Claim very carefully with this lady, who can substantiate some of the items, but I have no reason to doubt her statement as to all the property claimed for being in the premises on the day that the Hotel was destroyed. The only question that I raised was in regard to the extent of the depreciation, and in view of the length that some of the articles were in use I have deducted a percentage.

With reference to the bangle and the ring, an approximate value has been arrived at as they were Claimant's mother's jewellery and their actual value could not be traced. She is a superior woman and enjoyed the absolute confidence of the Manager and hotel staff. She was engaged at £30, plus board, lodging and laundry.
