

Interests in the buildings

The building in this case was owned by Lane, who became bankrupt, and the Munster & Leinster Bank had a mortgage thereon, but Claimant paid £350 in cash to the Bank and entered into occupation of premises under lease to keep same in repair and reduce mortgage annually. The Fire Policy is in Bank's name, but Claimant has partially carried out repairs. The Bank are making no claim for building as they state Brennan is liable therefor. The Plate Glass Policy with "Sun" relieves them from liability owing to "Clause" Rebellion &c. thereon.

The claim for stock was based on sale prices so after going over invoices with Claimant I arrived at value.


