Roof

Provide and fix new ton slates (about 50) in place of any broken etc.

Glass.

Clean out gutters, examine same and make good holes, if any.

Out out and renew all glass in windows, doorsand skylights broken

by bullets or maliciously.

Joinery

Include for making good paintwork to sashes after such renewal.

Repair all joinery damaged by shot or maliciously in the best

possible manner. In some cases (such as door to back room 2nd.floor)

complete renewal will be necessary. Include for priming, knotting

stopping and painting all new joinery, and for making good decorative painting.

Provide and fix new locks where old ones were forced.

Provide for renewing or refixing old handrail to stairs where taken away, including new turned balusters to match old, new mahogany handrail with ramps etc., painting, polishing etc., complete.

Renew low press in back room 2nd. floor, with doors, top, locks etc., and decoration.

Provide for renewal of antique press in shop, (shattered by shell) including mirrored plate glass, curved, moulded and carved mahogany doors, furniture, shelves, polishing etc.,

Renew broken parts of wall fitting opposite to last.

Walla.

Make good damage to walls and wall plaster in Keene's coment.

Provide for repapering rooms wherever walls have been injured,
with paper equal to old.
