Inspector's Remarks.

How the L. & N. W. Ry., a carrying Co. came to claim for a case and the Boots contained therein will I trust be gleaned from the following statement:—

The Railway Co. had the case for delivery to J. J. Stafford and Son, Ltd. of Brown St., Dublin but through some accidental cause the label became detached from the case and the driver, on the 14th April, 1916 brought the Goods to The Cable Boot Co., Ltd., 31 Lower Dackville Street and left them there. The Boot Co. soon discovered that the case was not theirs and in a post card dated the 18th April, asked the Railway Co. to remove it, but as the Co. had no opportunity of doing so up to the time of the rebellion the case in question, with its contents became involved in the general fire destruction of 31 Tr. Dackville Street. Messrs. Stafford were, at the moment, the losers and applied to the London and North Western Ry. Co. for compensation a lengthy correspondence ensued which terminated on the 26th Sep. last by the Ry. Co. forwarding a cheque for £42:3:0 to Messrs. Stafford.

I ascertained from Messrs. Stafford that the amount in question was the invoice price of the Boots, after the usual trade discounts for prompt payment had been deducted. Messrs. Stafford who are middlemen paid the Manufacturers the moment they were reimbursed by the Railway Company. I questioned Messrs. Stafford very closely as to the correctness of the amount and received such evidence as proved beyond all doubt that £42:3:0 was due the Manufacturers

by them and that should they (Messrs Stafford) have been compensated for any less amount they would have to make good the difference. For the satisfaction of the Committee I may mention that I perused a large amount of documentary evidence, taking such extracts as I thought germane to the case. I have received a signed declaration from Messrs. Stafford stating that they made no claim on the Committee in respect of the goods mentioned in the accompanying claim.

If my recommendation is passed a remittance should be made in favour of the London and North Western Ry. Co. and sent to H. G. Burgess at North Wall, Dublin.


