I, JOHN HOLLMEY, of the Firm of George Bell & Co. Lloyds' Agents in Dublin, now residing at Corn Exchange Buildings in the City of Dublin DO hereby Solemnly and Sincerely DECLARE that on or about the 24th day of April 1916, or th following days damage was done to a quantity of Goods (particulars of which are hereto annexed) stored at the Stores of the British & Irish Steam Packet Coy. Limited 25 27 Bix John Rogerson's Quay in the City of Dublin, and such damage was occasioned to the best of my information and belief by looters and pillagers, and I further DECLARE that th said Property and articles were so damaged or pillaged, that the quantity looted or pillaged was as is shewn in each cas that at the time of the destruction or damage they were res pactively of the insured values specified under the heading "Insured Value of Property at time of Destruction or Damage and that in consequence of such damage or pillaging claim i hereby made for the sums specified under the heading "Actua Loss and Amount claimed", that the claim is made by me on behalf of the Sea Insurance Coy. Ltd., who have admitted lia bility under a War Risk Policy for the several amounts so claimed, and my said Firm have investigated and reported thereon, and the said Sea Insurance Coy. Ltd. have settled

the said claims with the several Owners of the said Goods or with the British and Irish Steam Packet Coy.Ltd. on

behalf of the said Owners, and that no person is now interested in the said property except the said Sea Insurance
Coy. Ltd., and that the said Goods were not insured by me,
or any other person on behalf of the Sea Insurance Coy. Ltd.



The consignees in making up their claim omitted to ? 69 include, as well as the four chests looted, twenty-two his half-chests, which would bring up the total claim from £53.11s.0d. to £88.19s.1d. The consignees in question have since then called our clients' attention to their error, and Mr. Hollwey, of Messrs. George Bell & Co., Lloyds' Agent, having investigated the matter, has found that the revised figure is correct. We should be obliged if you would allow this item to be amended, and if you wish any further declaration made on the subject by Mr. Hollwey, we shall be happy to have same done on hearing from you to that effect.
