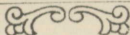

The summation of £98. 17. 4. on this claim is not correct, as will be seen by the pencil markings. Claimant is an old woman who looks after the tobacco shop herself with a young maid assistant. She has three rooms poorly furnished in a three-storey house over the shop, the remaining rooms being vacant. The Military (Leinster Regt.) under Major Metge occupied the premises for four days. She cannot vouch any of the items of claim. The jewellery - the principal portion of the claim - seems to have been left her by relations, and her estimation of the value of these articles is, I believe, excessive. The claim was previously signed "Teresa Daly" which was her maiden name. Her husband is dead some three years. There appears to have been a good deal of damage done to the slates, but no repairs to roof had been made for twenty years, and in allowing £12 I think Claimant is more than compensated for that particular damage.
