Interests in the buildings

Claimant was Manager of Messrs. J. G. Mooney & Co's (Wine & Spirit Dealers) premises at the time of the Rebellion. He was in illhealth some time previous to that and was in Beaumont Convalescent Home before and during the Rebellion. A party of the Royal Irish Rifles occupied these premises, and he states property was removed from his trunk. I have gone through the various articles with him and find the amounts overstated. I really believe I have erred on the side of leniency in naming £15. The military told Messrs. Mooney that incriminating evidence was found in his box, but Claimant himself has not apparently been suspected. Personally he may have a tendency to Sinn Feinism but the military or police have not questioned him in the matter.
