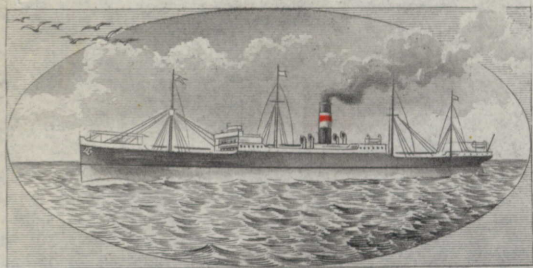



On the 20th. April we delivered to the Tedcastle Line T.S.&Co: 5 Hnds. Brandy ex "Jarnac" (March) to be forwarded under bond, on your account. The Customs have called upon us to pay the duty on 284.7 proof gallons as the goods have not been produced to the proper officer. We hear from Messrs. Tedcastle that the Brandy was destroyed during the rebellion while lying in their Store. We are applying to the Customs here to forego the duty involved, but in the event of their declining, we must look to you for this amount as bond was given on your behalf. No doubt you will make the necessary arrangements to have the amount covered when claiming on your Insurance Co:

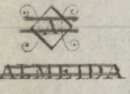

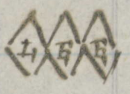
