

With reference to your letter of 5th inst. stating which that the sum of £8. 19. 6, had been deducted from our Claim was in respect of building repairs not covered by our Insurance Policy and for which it was understood that the Landlord was claiming - I beg to inform you that the Landlady's Solicitors Messrs Hayes & Sons of 41 Nassau St. have informed my Committee that the claim for £2. submitted by them was in respect of damage to the roof of the premises and that my Committee are liable for the damages set forth in our claim as we have agreed to keep the premises in repair, save the roof and outer walls.
