Since my last letter to you dated 24/6/16, and which is now
enclosed in the file of the correspondence I have had an interview
with Lance Corporal F.C.Godwin, 16 Lancers, Curragh. No.6464.
Who was in these premises on duty and who fed the Military Horses
referred to with my Oats during the Rebellion period when forage
was not procurable elsewhere.

You now have evidence you can look up and under the circumstanc
-es, I think my Bill should be paid by the Military Authorities not
the Civil Authorities.

If I am wrong in my contention then please send me back the
whole file of papers and I shall them in my claim to Dublin
Castle.
