Sir, I beg to append a claim hereto for property lost or stolen from me on the 25<sup>th</sup> April or during the period up to 29<sup>th</sup> April under the following circumstances.

On Tuesday the 25<sup>th</sup> April about 11.30am I was driving from County Meath through Dublin to Amiens Street & on reaching Church Street was fired upon by the

Rebels. I immediately  
jumped from the car  
but was taken from the  
rear & carried & held  
as prisoner in the Four  
courts until the surrender  
on the night of the 29<sup>th</sup>

On Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> April  
I proceeded to church &  
found the car standing  
there but most of its  
cushions & belongings  
had been taken. The car  
belonged to Lord Dunsany  
with whom I was driving  
who also was wounded  
& taken prisoner.

The suitcase I claim for  
was a presentation but  
the amount <sup>claimed</sup> is below the value

claimed.

The military authorities  
have plaid my claim  
for articles of military  
nature but do not accept  
articles of private nature  
hence this application.
