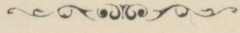

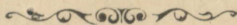

I beg to submit
a claim from the landlord
of the R.I.C. Barrack at
Enniscorthy for the sum of
£13. 15. 0. being expense
incurred in carrying out
necessary repairs to the
barrack owing to the injury
done to it by the Rebels.

The barrack sustained a
seize from early in the morning
on the 27th April to the morning
of 1st May 1916, during which time
a volume of Rifle fire was
directed on the barrack from
many commanding points.

at the East side of the barrack
where the Rebels were firing from
a considerable elevation the
roof and chimneys were very
seriously damaged. The slates
being so badly damaged that
the rain came in copiously
and it was necessary to
have the work done at once.

The windows and front of

Submitted for consideration.
The landlord of Enniscorthy
R.I.C. barrack claims £13.15/-
being cost of repairing damages
done to the barrack by Rebels
in April last.

Under Clause 2 of the
Barrack Agreement the
lessor is liable for cost
of all repairs except such
as become necessary owing to
wilful damage by the R.I.C.
Constabulary but the cir-
cumstances in the present
case are of course excep-
-tional.

barrack were also badly damaged and had to be repaired. I personally satisfied myself that no work was included in the estimate that was not absolutely necessary to repair damage caused by the attack on and the defence of the barrack.

The police entered into (file $\frac{898 F \times 24139}{24249}$ 19/8/15) possession of the barrack on 1/9/15 and I am aware that the landlord then expended over £150 in repairs, buildings, painting, etc. to fit the barrack for police occupation and it was in splendid repair up to the time of the attack on it. Under the circumstances I am of opinion that the landlord cannot be held responsible for making good the damage. The estimate appears to me to be reasonable.
