The Property Losses Committee,
Gentlemen,

With reference to above claim for stock, fixtures & furniture destroyed during the recent rebellion, in connection with which I was paid the sum of £1,400 on account in October last, and a few days ago I was favoured with a further payment of £544 in full settlement of my claim of £2,548-13-1.

This amount I desire to state merely covered the actual cost of the goods which I had in stock at the time. The Assessors insisted upon invoices, or certified copies, being supplied to them to verify the different sums set out in the claim, this request I complied with, and after giving them all the assistance possible, I was convinced that they considered my claim a moderate one.

Owing to the unreasonable deductions made by some of the responsible parties who have dealt with the claim, I am reluctantly compelled to bring the matter under the notice of your committee with a view of having it further considered, a request which I hope they will see their way to grant.

For some months prior to the disturbances I bought all the available stock I could procure, knowing well that as time went on there would be little, or no goods in the market, and naturally it is only business at such a time to secure against eventualities.

Reply that the committee's recommendation to the

a position to reopen the matter.

For about sixty years the stock was only covered by £1,000, and notwithstanding this evident immunity from risks I felt it my duty to increase the insurance by £500 about five years ago,

Consequent upon the recent great increase of stock, I was obliged to extend my premises (as per contract £200 set out in building claim)

It was my intention to increase insurance on stock and fixtures by £1,000 for at least a year, and the building by £200 permanently, but unfortunately the contractors far exceeded their time in completing the work, and only got finished three days before Easter, therefore I was delayed, hence my troubles now.

It may be that this latter fact was not made sufficiently clear to the assessors, otherwise I cannot conceive how I should be victimised to the extent of £541. of my hard earned capital, the result of my life's saving, and this I am sure unintentionally on your part and certainly not the intention of the Government.

If this sum had been added to instead of deducted from my claim, I would consider it nothing more than bare justice in compensating me for my losses, for I am certain if I had the same stock to-day, it would represent nearly double the amount claimed for.

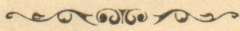
