We are acting for Mrs Louisa Isabell Purcell of No. 11 Serpentine Avenue Ballsbridge, whose house was operated on by the Military Authorities on Saturday the 29th April, consequent on their being rifle firing on the roof. Our client is the wife of Marmaduke F. Purcell C.E. who is engaged on Government work at His Majesty's Factory, Messrs Person & Son, Gretna. As the result of the firing on her house, for which she is but monthly tenant, furniture and effects to the value of £162:0:6 have been destroyed, and we wish to put forward a claim for this amount on her behalf through you as representing the Military Authorities.

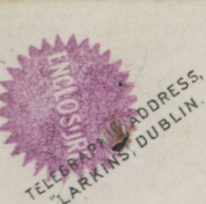
