

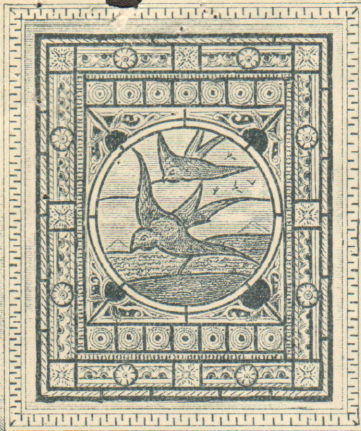

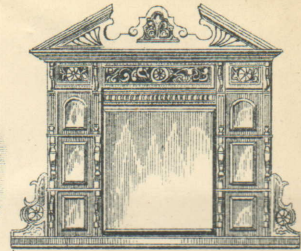

In accordance with your instructions I visited the premises Nos 33+34 North King St damaged during the recent rebellion & beg to report on same.

The shop doors will require new panels, the wall between Nos 32+33. shop floor which was broken through is very shaky & will require to be rebuilt & plastered. fixtures on said wall to be repaired & refixed. the flank wall adjoining 34+35. in hall & drawingroom floor where breaches were made will require to be rebuilt & plastered. owing to damage done to walls the drawingroom will require to be repapered & repainted, the hall will require the same treatment. the windows throughout the premises are badly damaged, some sashes will require repairing & all the broken windows new glazing. owing to the repairs to the woodwork it will be necessary to repaint same, the roof will require to be overhauled & breaches repaired I value the extent of the damage at forty five pounds
