Dear Sir,

I beg to submit a/c and vouchers for claim in respect of 26 Borrig Avenue, Kingstown, a house which the Military took possession of, and occupied as a barrack for several days during the disturbances, with the result ^{that} the paper on walls was soiled and torn, the glass specified was broken, the floors in the basement broken so that a carpenter had to be employed to put in new flooring, and even some flooring joists, a fire grate was torn out and the walls were injured in several places.

As you will see the amount of the a/c is higher than the original claim, particularly the cost of wallpaper, this is owing to the fact that I had not got full particulars of the expense, and as it was the last for furnishing, I had not time to check my a/c.
