Sir,

Please take notice that some time between the 28th April and 1st May 1916 on the premises of Messrs. Tedcastle McCormick & Co. Ltd situate at Sir John Rogerson's Quay, Dublin, the following goods, viz:- 113 Bags of Flour of 140 lbs weight each, branded "Bulletin" and 57 Bags of Flour of 140 lbs weight each branded "Copyright" were removed, trampled on and destroyed; that the said goods were the property of our clients Messrs. Walter Brown & Co. of Hanover Street Flour Mills, Dublin, who havethereby sustained loss to the amount of £250, and that as a matter of precaution an Information to this effect has already been sworn by our clients and an application for compensation lodged with the Clerk of the Peace, Court House, Green Street, Dublin, for hearing before the Right Hon. the Recorder of Dublin on the 9th day of June next.

The injuries caused were undoubtedly the outcome of the recent Rebellion and it is questionable whether the said injuries come within any of the Malicious Damage Acts.

The Applicants will withdraw their claim for malicious injury if they come within the Government scheme of compensation, as it seems to them to form part of the damage which the State intended to make good.

We should be glad to know definitely whether the Applicants will be compensated by the Government on satisfactory proof -

- (a) that the damage was caused by the Rebellion,
- (b) the amount of the damage?
