Dear Sirs,

With reference to your Claim of £20:0:10. for butter lost in transit to Mr. Dolan, Belfast, on the 22nd. April last. I beg to inform you that the wagon carrying the consignment referred to was held up in Dublin during, and because of the Rebellion, and while there was looted at our North Wall Station; the butter claimed for then disappeared. In these circumstances the Company cannot admit liability, as the loss was beyond our control. To assist you, however, I placed your Claim before the Property Losses (Ireland) Committee 1916 and have been informed that such claims should be made upon the Committee by the owners of the looted property. Will you please therefore address your claim to the Secretary of that Committee, J. J. Healy Esq., 51 St. Stephens Green, Dublin. This should be done at once as they are closing their books.
