Interests in the buildings I interviewed this Lady, and she informed me that the articles were looted under circumstances as mentioned in Solicitors letter. She also stated that some of the articles were presents, and so could not obtain receipts for the purchase.

The cups were purchased in Messrs Weirs (and were christening cups) on whom I called, and was informed that at the outside they would not cost more than £3:10:0 each, and that £3 is a good average price. The Claimant is however a very respectable person, and would not to my mind knowingly make an excessive claim, I would therefore recommend the payment of £12 in settlement.

Re. Mrs. Foley's Claim.

We enclose you Claim in duplicate on behalf of the above-named for £15. 18. 0. together with her Fire Policy. We may mention that it was only this morning that this lady called on us as she was not aware that there was a time limit for putting in her Claim, but owing to the peculiar circumstances under which these articles were looted we have no doubt that you will, as an act of grace, extend the time so far as she is concerned and accept same.

She informs us that during the Rebellion she, at great inconvenience, did all she could to make the part taken by His Majesty's Troops as easy as possible for them by bringing all soldiers who were about on Sentry Duty into her house and entertaining them.

On the 27th April she had seven soldiers in to dinner and just after they had gone she noticed that they had annexed the articles for which she now claims.
