Sir

Re attached communication. I beg to report that Mrs Boylan is not claiming £6 for damage to a Hay Rick but she is claiming it for damage done, by the Military during the Rebellion, to a Large Tarpaulin Hay-Rick Cover which was commandeered by the Military at the time. From inquire made this cover was seriously damaged. It appears it cost £6. when purchased by Mrs Boylan. and is stated now to be useless for the purpose for what it was purchased. She claims the full amount. even if not used as a Rick Cover, it could be used for some other purpose & the loss I am sure would hardly be more than £4 for this article. This is only my opinion.

As regards the Sledge Hammer & the Shovel. These articles were commandeered by the Military and they were not returned to Mrs Boylan, and the amount looked for is about what they cost.

I have not seen the Rick Cover but from what I can ascertain it was very badly injured when returned.

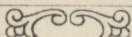
