Memorandum to the City Engineer.

Re Corporation property damaged in
the recent rebellion.

I give hereunder copy of report and estimate sent
in by Inspector J.Howett on this matter:

"The following is estimate for repairing footpath
"and roadways damaged during and subsequent to the
"disturbance in the City. Flagging, resetting flags (old)
"which are not damaged and replacing broken flags by new
"material. It does not include redressing the old material
"so I do not think it would be fair to charge for dressing
"old flags which had already been worn, only resetting the
"flags that are not broken and replacing the broken by new
"material. Asphalt relaying on existing concrete foundation.
"Wood paving on existing foundation.

"There is an increase in the estimates in con-
"sequence of the increase in price of all classes of materials,
"also increase in wages and Horse hire. It does not include
"the setting of area lights or area grates as it would be a
"matter for the owners of the property."
