Thank you me
intruding on your valuable

I was returning from my
brother in law's death-bed
accompanied by my brother
and sister, coming to Sandwich

Railway Station I asked the Sentry
could he pass. he asked the
Sergeant but he ordered us
to be taken to the Town Hall
Barracks where we were
retained for eight days
a Corporal of the Dratts and
Derbys took over 5 shillings
in money my silver watch
and needed a keeprake
from my dead father
and I have never seen
or got them since I
have been to two or three
Barracks but they have

never looked up my case
I have been instructed to
write to you, hoping dear
Sir for some information
concerning them and
hoping also to be excused
this liberty. I remain
