Property Losses, Ireland, Committee 1916

Sir

I beg to enclose two Forms of Declaration duly sworn, and Policy of Insurance, & Receipt  
At noon on 24<sup>th</sup> apr an officer of the Irish Volunteers entered my premises here, and expelled my self wife and children from them. He said they wanted them for the Irish Republican Army. Dr. Joseph Carroll of Richmond Hospital seeing our predicament gave us shelter for that day. That night my wife & family had to go to the North Dublin Union where they remained until following morning when a friend gave us shelter for remainder of the week.

On the Evening of Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> April I saw the premises and they were still in the possession of the Volunteers.

On Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> at noon I again saw them, when to my amazement I found shop door & gates open and Volunteers gone, and my shop looted.

I saw the Captain of Volunteers who said he was very sorry. I asked him if I could fix up door & gate. He said I might but I must leave the wicket gate open.

The military searched my house on Sunday 30 apr at 10.30 A.M. I asked the Corporal in charge if I could take possession and he said "yes you have suffered enough". I secured door & gate & self and family resumed possession on Monday after a week out of it
