Claimant is owner. He had a contract on hand for interests in the buildings O'Brien Ho. Aerated Water Manufacturers, at the time of the rebellion. Part of the contract included the putting on of a new glazed and corrugated iron roof. A large quantity of glass was not touched but all the corrugated iron including some nails and washers were taken, it is thought, for barricade purposes. Interviewed Mr. O'Brien and another disinterested party and received ample confirmation of the fact that the premises were broken into. The amount claimed represents the nett invoice price of the materials.
