Plaster.

All plaster to be made good with Kane Cement to prevent same when painted from discolouring.

To supply and fix one large pane of plate glass in front.

Painting.

All wood work of shop front and side to be well washed and pumiced and painted with two coats of best oil paint colour same as before and finished with one coat of best hard Oals Tarnish.
