Duns (he died in my arms half way) also that I was one of defenders of Trinity College. and hold one of the Cups ^{See Irish Times} and hold letters from Major Harris Adjutant of D. to O.T.C in connection with that time - My Claim is for a matter of £100 - for damage to my furniture and if it is necessary to have it set out on a form I would be glad of same at convenience

Dear Sir

On Wednesday 26th inst afternoon two Soldiers
P^{ts} Oldham & Keeling (Robinhoods?) took shelter in my
house as above and were in same when a Search
party demanded and were immediately given
admittance and satisfied themselves house
friendly. Immediately on entering one of Search
party P^t Whitby was wounded by Rifle shot from
one of your men outside - Search party left
my house leaving wounded man whom we
dressed and P^{ts} Oldham and Keeling (3 in all) - My
house shortly afterwards was subjected to
concentrated Rifle fire and finally bombed causing
much damage and risk to ours and your Soldiers
lives - When evening came and it was safe
with your Officers in charge approval I brought
wounded man to Baginbun P^t Hospital and he remains
a patient - Your investigation of this huge blunder
will much oblige as it may effect my chance
of Compensation if any available and much loss
of life might have resulted
