So as to get over the difficulty in regard to the words "in full discharge of your claim (No. 5745) for compensation" inserted in the cheque dated 27th October, 1916, for £49: 8: 6, which we return, we shall feel much obliged if you can have an endorsement placed thereon to the effect that the payment is only in respect of loss of Cylinders referred to in the claim, and not as a payment on account of the claim generally.
