In reply to your letter of the 27th ultimo, in which you ask for a reply to the cuery in your letter to the Under Secretary of 23rd idem, I am directed to state that this Committee's position in regard to the claim of the Grand Canal Company is made clear in their letter to you of the 8th November.

The only portion of the claim which the Committee can deal with, that relating to boat cylinders has been disposed of. The other portion, relating to loss of traffic and business, cannot, as already stated, be dealt with by the Committee, and they regret that they do not feel able to advise you on the points raised in your letter of 23rd November to the Under Secretary, which it is presumed refer only to this part of the claim.

Our clients' claim in this case amounts to £2210:15: 5. We recently received from you the enclosed cheque for '49: 8: 6 which is stated on the face thereof to be in full discharge of our clients' claim for compensation.

As a result of correspondence with the Secretary of the Property Losses (Ireland) Committee, 1916, we have ascertained that the £49: 8: 6 represents compensation in respect of Cylinders only, but having regard to the form of the cheque our clients wish to have this fact specially recorded, and we, accordingly, send you copy of letter which we received from the Secretary of the Property Losses (Ireland) Committee, of the 8th instant, and a copy of our letter to him of the 10th instant.

Dear Sir.

So as to get over the difficulty in regard to the words in full discharge of your claim (No. 5745) for compensation" inserted in the cheque dated 27th October, 1916, for £49: 8: 6, which we return, we shall feel much obliged if you can have an endorsement placed thereon to the effect that the payment is only in respect of loss of Cylinders referred to in the claim, and not as a payment on account of the claim generally.

The other and larger part of the claim may be dealt with hereafter by an alteration in the terms of reference to the Committee by Legislation or by some proceeding at law, and our clients naturally do not wish their position to be prejudiced, having regard to the serious loss which their Shareholders have suffered, by how giving a receipt in full discharge of their claim for compensation when the cheque sent is merely in respect of a particular item in such claim.
