Dear Sir,

I beg to advise you that I have now ascertained that the dome of our building was injured by bullet holes at the time of the recent rebellion. The water leakage was noticed by our porter shortly after the rebellion when the rain came, but a few days afterwards on going myself I could not trace the leakages. When rain came again however they became apparent, and I at once instructed our contractors to report to me in the matter. This they did as far as possible from the roof. They could not however properly estimate or do the repairs without scaffolding, so I authorised them to proceed with same and to effect the necessary repairs. I have now received their account which amounts to £5.17. 0. as follows: -
