## Interests in the buildings

(a) These premises were occupied by the Sinn Feiners and afterwards by the Military. The goods claimed for were all missed on Claimant's return to the premises. She is eminently respectable, but did not quite understand the filling in of the forms, as in some instances she claims more than the cost price of the articles. Having gone into the matter with her, I put her actual loss down as £5. The servant, Bridget Flynn, lost four blouses the cost price of which is put down as 30/-, the claim being made for £2. This item I think is exaggerated, and I think £1. will be ample.

(b) The actual outlay to the roofs of the Cottages is £4. 11. 5., which amount I recommend. When I inquired into the Insurances I found that the Trustees of Mrs. Kenny - Mr. John Sheridan, Solicitor, and Mr. John White, Solicitor - both of
