In reply to your esteemed enquiry re new flooring, we beg to state that we propose to supply 8"6" of Border, and 10"0" x 6"0", and 8"0" x 6"0", and several odd pieces about 1ft. sq. of the same design and pattern as the existing flooring, and to fix same on a properly prepared bed by an expert craftsman, and have the work completed to your satisfaction, for the sum of TWENTY FIVE POUNDS ..... £25 . 0 . 0

We may point out that cost of the material has increased considerably, and that it will take some little time to obtain, and as the fixing will have to be done on a holiday, and perhaps the following Sunday, provision had to be made for over-time.

We do not consider that patching the vacant spaces would be a satisfactory job, and would be glad to have your further instructions in the matter so that we may get the Tilers to supply the material.

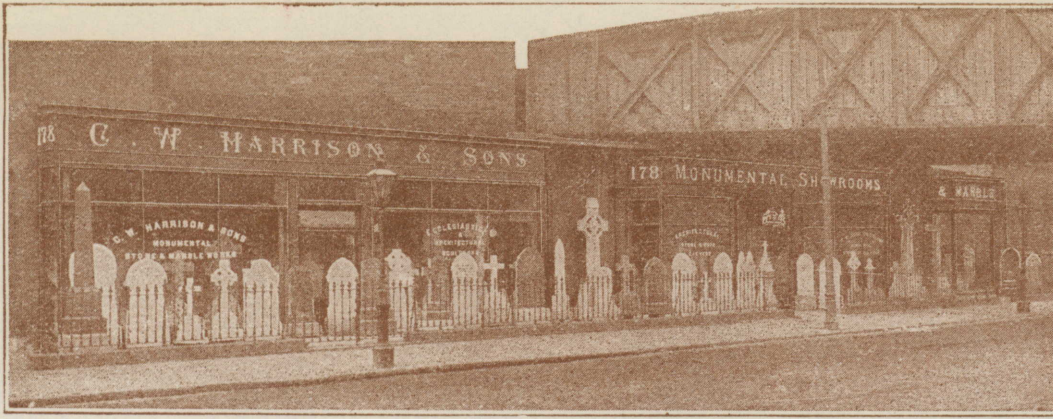

Manager when the men had to leave the Building.
