With reference to your letter of the 6th inst .  
inquiring as to whether the Rev . E . H . Lewis-Crosby intends  
lodging a claim in this matter , I have to state that a claim



originally put in ought to suffice . My client's object is to ensure that whatever sums are awarded by your Committee may be paid in such a way that they will be under the joint control of my client and the Lessees so that the proceeds may be expended in new buildings to be erected on the plots .

Furthermore , if the Committee insist on my client putting in separate claims for each house it would necessitate his having a Valuation made for that purpose , and I feel sure that if your Committee will reconsider the matter they will see their way to withdraw the request for separate claims in respect of each of the premises , and particularly having regard to the fact that the freehold Estate is vested in my client in respect of each of the premises .

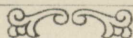
