Dear Mr. Scott,

I sent away the gold watch for a new movement, and have to-day heard from the manufacturers as follows : - "We find that the watch has been subjected to such terrific fire that the gold in the case has become quite brittle and with the exception of the back and cover impossible to work again. In fact in removing the pendant arbor which had become fastened to the pendant, the band collapsed altogether so that the only original parts of the watch we can use will be the back and cover of the case. We could fit these and supply new parts and a new $\frac{3}{4}$ plate keyless movement, and allow you for the weight of gold in the case not used for £12.10.0."

As this is so much in excess of the sum I mentioned to you, viz. £7.10.0. I hesitate to proceed without first communicating with you.

Of course I never anticipated having to supply nearly a whole new case, as it seemed to be in good order and it was only when they commenced to take it asunder that we found out the fire had played such sad havoc with it.
