Interests in the buildings This is a very old man (102 years of age) and is in very poor circumstances. The claim of £14:10:0 is reasonable, as the roof has been badly damaged. The claimant however states that all the damage may or may not have been caused through the Rebellion, as previous to that time small boys in the neighbourhood very often used to climb on the roof. He also states that he will not have the repairs carried out at his time of life, and therefore under the circumstances I would recommend a payment of £10.
