Remarks

I went carefully through each item of Claim with Claimant and his Solicitors' representative Mr. Browner. The shop only is occupied by Claimant, who rents out the upper portion of the building to various tenants; one of these - a man named Stringer - disappeared at the time of the Rising and I cannot trace him. While one pane of the plate glass was broken by bullets, entry does not appear to have been effected by this window but through the hall door at the side of the shop. Claimant did not state that the building was insured in the "Yorkshire": I elicited this information from him, and after going through his lease find he is responsible to repair the damage. He holds under a lease 99 years from April 1875 - Kate Armstrong to Henry Lyon, Lyon's interest being assigned to W. H. Griffin in 1886, and the subsequent assignment to the present occupier Duggan in November 1892. The repairs to the building are overstated; Claimant admits this now on going into the matter with me, the actual repairs to the roof being carried out at £2. 5. 2. Two doors have to be repaired and some locks. The Solicitor agrees that my assessment of the building loss is fair and reasonable.

Remarks

I have gone through each item of the Stock claim with the invoices and find the amounts correctly stated, with the exception of the barrel of linseed oil. £9. 6. 0. is claimed therefor. Invoice shows £8. 19. 0. and Claimant states the former figure was an error. After passing all the items at cost price, with this exception, I put the figure at £19. 5. 8.

The £25 named for Fixtures and Fittings is all made up of the one item - Cash Till. The front only was damaged, and as it was an antiquated one Record British Machine Co. of Halifax, Yorks. - £5 is ample to compensate: it may possibly be repaired for slightly under this figure.
