The alignment of this frontage which stands completely intact has been passed by the Corporation Planning Committee & the Plans which are exactly as before its destruction (but now needing the necessary repairs) passed by the City Architect C. J. McCarty Esq M R I on the 9th August. For reference I enclose you copy of my previous letter to you dated August 7th.

This explains the age of the house, &c. In fact Messrs Arnott constructed it so as to match their own buildings next door & used it themselves as their mantle & costume departments during the time of reconstructing their own Warehouse. After their big fire they approved my plans. Any information that would expedite my starting to repair it now would be very useful to me. I hope you will consider it an exceptional case & oblige

On the latter date you were engaged & I unfortunately was unable to convey by an Mr Montgomerie's request to ask if you would kindly expedite my Building claim, which he considers an exceptional case. as the frontage in its entirety, & most of the side walls are standing, & for which I have not made a claim

The house is next door to Miss Arnott's on the Nelson pillar side of it, & on the other side of it is Harrison's Restaurant; with both of which it is in perfect alignment, & their Warehouse is also built at rear of them 2 houses back to Princes St. In fact it was built by Arnott's about the year 1899 while in keeping with their own Warehouse & they are also landlords of both houses.

To Dear Mr. O'Dayr.

In reply to your enquiry re prices for replacement of your stock of the principal lines as supplied by us in the past to you. You may take into consideration the price of advance in all woollen goods. As an illustration of tweed suits you used to buy from us at 14/.. the price of these today is 24/.. The suit you used to buy at 19/6 is now 27/6. Other styles of suits & trousers are proportionately increased. The black & blue serges that you were in the habit of buying from us are mostly unprocurable & what we can supply are even more advanced than are the tweeds. This is occasioned by the shortage of labour & dye wares.

I would suggest that if you make your calculations of getting our goods of last year replaced, you might calculate on paying

50% all round increase on last year prices.

This is altogether apart from the cost of same quality of goods bought 2 years ago & which you had in stock when I called to see you in January last. The difference in price of these goods would be fully 60% more now.

I shall be glad if you will let me know at your earliest possible opportunity when you will be in a position to buy again, as prices are still on the increase & our stocks are very low & I am afraid of an absolute shortage if the war is not finished very quickly with kind regards.
