The Tower of this Church, built of granite & Portland Stone, was taken possession of by the Military for Signalling & observation purposes. Snipers kept firing at it and the bullets caused considerable damage to the ornamental stone work & Mullions. Large pieces of stone have been shot away and if the basis of allowance be a complete restoration of all damage caused by shots, the sum of £500 will be required. An expensive scaffolding will be required to execute the repairs which can only be carried out on a "time & material" contract. The eight pinnacles on top of the Tower have all suffered damage.. Stone Mullions supporting the tracery above were badly injured and replacement will be an expensive item.
