My late husband, John O'Shaughnessy, made a short will in September 1909 which was drawn by Messrs Gerrard & Co., Solicitors, 25 Westmoreland Street, Dublin, leaving his entire property to me as there were no children of our marriage, and appointing me his sole executrix. The probate was never taken out as my solicitors were of opinion it was not necessary to do so in view of the amount of his estate. The will which was later on given to me by Messrs Gerrard & Co., was destroyed in the fire with all my other effects at 5 Upper Sackville Street on April 25th. His share in the firm of O'Shaughnessy and Gannon at date of his death as shown by the books of the firm was £326. 8. 1. He had no other assets or property with the exception of the furniture and household effects.
