This claim is for the duty on whiskey looted from the bonded store. Claimants did not consider they would be called upon by the Excise to pay the duty thereon, and did not claim accordingly. Our Report dated 14th August, No. 2077, only dealt with the value of the whiskey and casks (£158-8-1), exclusive of duty. The Excise authorities now claim the duty, amounting to £206-17-7, regarding which please see their letter of 30th August.
