Madam,

In reply to your letter of yesterday's date I beg to state that the claim served upon me, to which you refer, was treated as an application for compensation under the Malicious Damage Acts. All the cases so received were struck out of the list by the Right Hon. the Recorder of Dublin on the ground that compensation was being assessed in respect of the same injuries by Sir William Goulding's Commission. Your claim was not submitted to the Commissioners who require the claims to be presented on forms prepared by themselves. I would suggest that you should communicate with the Secretary to the Commission at No. 51 St. Stephen's Green.
